

Wrap-up report: Getting Published – Effectively Communicating Your Research for Kyoto University

The Nature Research Academies team was delighted to hold a virtual author workshop for Kyoto University on 18, 21, 22, and 24 November 2022. The Nature Research Academies author workshops are designed to give researchers the foundations to clearly communicate their research in their manuscripts to increase their chances of publication and maximize their impact worldwide. To achieve these objectives, we used a combination of short lectures, open discussion and practical exercises.

Participants were asked to complete an online feedback form at the end of the workshop to report their overall satisfaction, with 112 feedback forms completed. This document contains the summary of this feedback.

Background

The virtual workshop comprised four 2-hour webinars on 18, 21, 22, and 24 November 2022.

99.1% of the respondents felt the **overall quality** of the workshop was either excellent (87.7%) or good (11.4%)

Figure 1: 100% of the attendees either strongly agreed (92%) or agreed (8%) that the trainer was **knowledgeable**.




Figure 2: 96.4% of the attendees either strongly agreed (79.5%) or agreed (17.0%) that the topics were *relevant*. The attendee that 'disagreed' works in applied physics and felt the life science examples were not as relevant for their research.






Figure 3: *97.3%* of the attendees either strongly agreed (86.6%) or agreed (10.7%) that the slides were *clear* and *engaging*.




Figure 4: 98.2% of the attendees either strongly agreed (84.8%) or agreed (13.4%) that they will be able to *apply* what they have learnt to their work. The attendee who 'disagreed' felt they were too experienced for this workshop, as their comment was "Only for beginners, this lecture is essential".






Figure 5: *93.3%* of the attendees either strongly agreed (57.1%) or agreed (36.2%) that they feel more *confident* writing and submitting manuscripts after attending this workshop. The attendee that 'disagreed' is the same one who voted 'disagree' in Figure 4 and felt this workshop was more appropriate for early career researchers.




Figure 6. Attendees were asked to rate the usefulness of the modules from extremely useful to not at all useful. 'Logical Manuscript Structure' was the top-rated module, although the remaining modules were also highly rated by the respondents.






Figure 7. Attendees were asked to rate the appropriateness of the *workshop length*. 72.3% of the attendees felt the workshop length was just right, while 7.1% and 20.5% felt it was too short or long, respectively.





Figure 8. Net Promoter Score (NPS). Attendees were asked to rate how likely they would **recommend** this workshop to their colleagues on a scale of 1 to 10. Scores of 9 or 10 are considered 'promoters', scores of 7 or 8 are considered 'passive', and scores of 1–6 are considered 'detractors'. The NPS is calculated by subtracting the detractor percentage from the promoter percentage. An NPS >50 is considered good while an NPS > 70 is considered excellent. The NPS from this workshop was **72.7**.
